Here's a Bible trivia question for you: What is the only miracle story to appear in all four gospels? Answer: The feeding of the 5,000! What does this mean? One meaning is that God provides hope and food even when resources appear slim.

Emerging out of the pandemic is a slow process (with much still ahead). We see it in congregations, including Augustana Lutheran Church. This slow emergence can feel as if resources are slim. Yet even with minimal resources, like a few loaves and a couple fish, God provides.

As a faith community this congregation needs your help to witness God's presence in past and present ministry, and to vision for the future. Come to the **congregational meeting on August 15**th, (Read further for more info) to share and hear how God provides.

God has provided another opportunity in my own call process. In August I will begin as half-time Interim Associate Campus Pastor at Augustana University. I will continue at ALC as well, having gone down to half-time as of July 1st. Both interim positions being half-time allows me to serve in both capacities, and it may provide interesting ministry partnership.

Me going down half-time at ALC (previously 2/3) also indicates a need. As you can see over the course of 2021, ALC's general offerings are down considerably, enough that it was right for me to be half-time. Sometimes it feels like we only have a few loaves of bread and a couple of fish. But, like the feeding miracle story, God can and does provide. It is such an important message that the feeding of the 5,000 appears in all four gospels.

How can you be a part of God's generosity? In your giving, in your inviting of others into this ministry, in your prayers and in your praise. God provides.




We will be having the Blessings of the Backpacks on August 22 during church. All students & educators of all ages will be blessed for the coming school year.

From the Bishop's Desk

Grace and peace to you!

Is your tank full or empty these days? Many among us had thought that the Covid vaccine and summer would bring relief to our chronic state of exhaustion. But as I listen to folks across the state and across the church, I frequently hear that that is not the case. Exhaustion is still lingering in our bones. Going back to normal doesn't seem to come as readily as we had hoped. You

have heard me say it many times, but I'll say it again, while we may return to normal by what meets the eye, no mask-wearing, and social events, etc, COVID has altered who we are as individuals and as communities. We all ran a mental, emotional, and physical marathon, and we need to understand that we need to recover.

I am a runner, and I know that after each long run I have to allow my body to rest. Rest is essential for my tired bones and overworked muscles to rejuvenate so that I am able to run again. Resting doesn't mean vegging out on the couch doing nothing, in fact, that kind of behavior would be counterproductive to restoring my energy and running capacity. Resting means to slow down and gently begin moving forward through mindful stretches and movement.

As we plan for fall activities with the hope that we will return to normal and go at full speed, please be mindful that your "church muscles" just emerged from running a marathon and will need gentle but disciplined movement in order to recover. I recommend that you utilize the revitalization tools we offer to slowly ease into fall. If you would like to know more, please contact Pastor Jonathan Steiner at jsteiner@sdsynod.org. Be gracious with each, readiness to restart ministry is different for everyone.

Please, always remember that this is God's Church, that it is not through our own works that we are saved and beloved, but solemnly by and through the grace and mercy of God. Be patient with yourself and your neighbor and begin everything you do with some deep breaths and prayer.
