Courage.

We need a jolt of courage in various moments of our lives, probably in moments of each day. Courage is a gift given to us by God, and through communities and individuals.

There's a prayer titled the "Prayer of Good Courage", which has been used at retreat centers, campus ministries,

congregations, and in many other settings. I first heard it while visiting Holden Village, which is a Lutheran/spiritual retreat center in the Cascade Mountain Range of Washington state.

Here is the prayer:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Often it is used to send people out. Holden Village is a retreat center at which most people only stay for one week. But last month we used it for move-in day worship service at Augustana University Campus Ministry as first-year students and families gathered to begin their collegiate academic careers. Those students and families were plunged into activities and realities which are new and different. We take plunges, too: Different phases of the life cycle, making tough decisions, experiencing change, and other new realities.

As the giver of faith and courage, God gives us the support we need to gather in new ways and to be sent in new ways, too.

Fall is a time of new starts, including in congregations like our's. We prepare for the annual block party/fiesta and the fall bazaar. May we have courage to invite, welcome, and care for those who gather. And, may we have the courage to be sent out in order to meet people where they're at, sharing God's love. May God give us the courage.

a word from The Church Council

The Augustana church council continues to meet monthly to plan events and discuss the future. We've created a Building Task Force to focus on the various and increasing needs of our building, and each month we discuss our response to the ongoing pandemic.

In August we spent most of our time discussing and planning the congregational meeting held on Sunday, August 15. Nearly 30 members and friends of the congregation attended the meeting, where we held devotions, discussed trends in the congregation and neighborhood and discussed our hopes and fears regarding the future of the church.

For those who weren't there, here is the information we discussed:

Church attendance: COVID has had a major impact on our congregation. Between 2013-2019, Augustana had relatively steady weekly attendance of between 50-60 people per week. In 2020 our average in-person attendance was 22, while over 100 people viewed weekly videos and other online content.

Giving: Giving to the congregation has declined steadily, but also decreased sharply in 2020 and has decreased again in 2021.

Neighborhood trends: This part of Sioux Falls is changing rapidly. According to demographic information provided by the ELCA, 14% of the households in the neighborhood receive food stamps, 19% do not speak English at home, and 22% include at least one person with a disability. 40% spend more than one-third of their income on rent, meaning they are at risk of not being able to meet basic expenses. 65% of the neighborhood is White, and there are significant Latino, Black, Native American and Asian communities. The majority are renters, and this group includes both families and single adults.

The call committee then led small group discussions, and the information gathered from them has been given to the call committee as they begin their work. Pastor Jon has also had discussions with a few people who were not able to attend and wanted to share their perspective.

Thanks to Pastor Jon and to call committee and council members for their help with this meeting. I would be glad to discuss any of this with you if you have questions, and have included my email address below. Please keep our congregation and its leaders in your prayers as we discern our future.

Consider helping at the Church Bazaar & Vendor Fair.


We are in need of people to help make the Lefse on September 25 & Rosettes on October 23.

FOOD-TO-YOU -




