In March, the Augustana Church Council welcomed two new members elected at the 2022 Annual Meeting. Thanks to Terry Engebretson and Crystal Bartling for serving on the council.

We also discussed and approved a partnership agreement with Pueblo de Dios, something that was introduced during our Ministry Site Study. This agreement clarifies our relationship and commits us to shared activities and meetings, such as this year's Ash Wednesday service. We are working with Pueblo de Dios to translate the agreement and other shared documents into Spanish.

Each month during the pandemic, the council has discussed our congregation's response. This month, with case numbers declining, we have reinstituted coming forward to receive communion and opened the pews that had been closed for social distancing. We will monitor this each month and respond to changing conditions as needed.

Noisy Offering-The Noisy Offering in April go to "Lutheran Outdoors in South Dakota (ELCA outdoor camping ministries.



Author Gregory

Boyle is a Jesuit priest who began preaching at a Catholic church in Los Angeles in the 1980's. He witnessed how much gang violence there was in the area and started a school program for those students who had been expelled from their regular schools because they belonged to gangs. Later with help from philanthropist Ray Stark, he founded Homeboy Industries to provide employment opportunities as well as tattoo removal services for ex-gang members looking for change in their lives.

Arranged by theme and filled with humor and glowing generosity, these essays about universal kinship and redemption are moving examples of the power of unconditional love and the importance of fighting despair.


Tattos on the Heart reminds us that no life is less valuable than another.

Building Update

A couple major projects will soon be underway at Augustana. First, replacement of two furnaces and a water heater are scheduled for the week of March 28th. Costs for the project are expected to be \$11,476.65. Fortunately special donations from members totaling \$11,600 have generously been made to cover the work.

Removal of a portion of the weather-damaged chimney and capping off what remains will take place after the furnaces and water heater are completed. A sizeable insurance check has

been received which should cover the majority of that project.


