




Noisy Offering-The Noisy Offering in February will go to "Lutheran Outdoors:"



Summary:


Total income for the month of December was \$13,831.08 vs. a monthly budget of \$13,562.50 for a favorable variance of \$268.58 or 1.9% for December.

On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$134,132.41 vs. a budget of \$162,750.00 for an unfavorable variance of \$28,618.00 or 17.6%. However, note that expenses last year were lower than anticipated, mainly due to changes in staffing & benefits, so receipts actually surpassed expenses by \$5,329.91.

Balance remaining on the mortgage: \$25,503.66


