## Good News from Augustana Lutheran Church



“For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me...”

-Matthew 25:35

I wanted to share a story with you. A story of which you are a part.

A couple weeks ago, a young family arrived as LOGOS children’s ministry programming was gathered for the Wednesday evening meal, education, and activities. It was a set of parents and their almost-two-year-old daughter. I hadn’t met them before, but they knew some of the leaders from Pueblo de Dios.

Through conversation with other adults and with the family themselves, I learned some of their story. They are Haitian and had recently arrived in the USA. They are official asylum seekers who had been on a journey out of Haiti that took them through Mexico and ended with them traveling from Chile to the USA. They traveled through eight countries in total, and walking through Panama and Columbia entirely by foot.

There are pieces of their story I don’t know, but somehow they arrived in Sioux Falls, and to Pueblo de Dios. They have attended weekly worship services with Pueblo de Dios, received support from another ELCA congregation in town, and have been welcomed following their long, difficult journey to safety.

Truly amazing what they have been through!

The vote will be held by ballot and a two-thirds majority of voting members attending is required to call the candidate.

## Annual Meeting Report

On February 13, Augustana Lutheran held our rescheduled 2022 Annual Meeting. Members reviewed the 2021 Annual Report, which included financial information, reports from church committees and partner organizations, our yearly statistical report, and the 2022 ballot. Along with new members of the church council, members elected representatives to the Bethany Home board, and to the South Dakota Synod Assembly. We heard about the storm damage to the church's chimney and approved a fundraising campaign to purchase new furnaces and a new water heater. We also took a final vote that completed the process of updating the church's constitution and bylaws.

We are still looking for a male voting member and a youth voting member to the SD Synod Assembly, which will be held June 3-4 at Our Savior's in Sioux Falls. Please contact Pastor Jon or Anna Amundson if you are interested in attending.

## Lent and Ash Wednesday

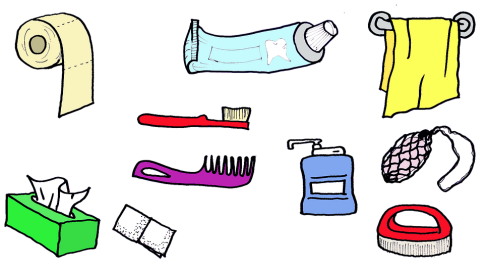

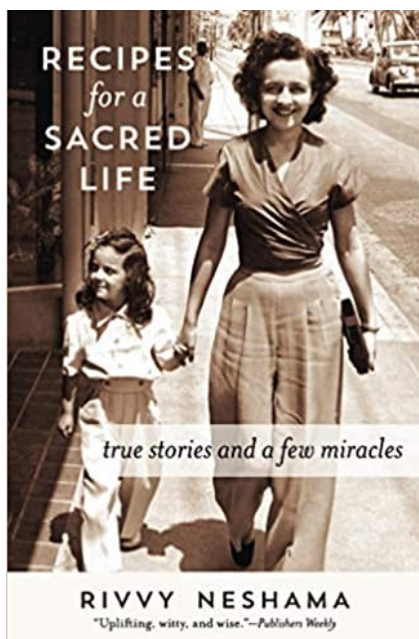

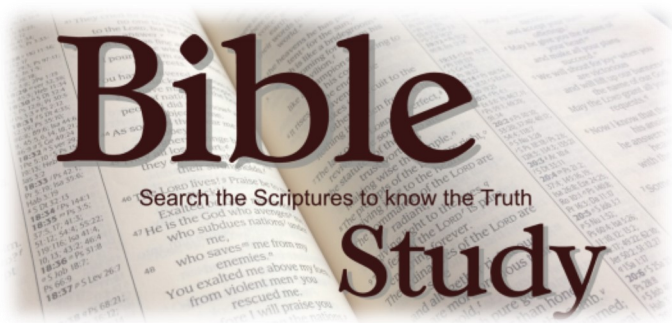

#### Summary:

Based on the \$143,050 budget passed at the recent annual meeting, \$11,920.83 is needed on a monthly basis for operation of Augustana's mission. In January, receipts met 70% of the monthly budget. Fortunately expenses were lower than anticipated, or 24% under budget.

## From the Bishop's Desk

Greetings in the name of Christ,

I would like to begin by thanking all of the Lay leaders that participated in the second annual "I have been elected to the council, now what?" zoom call. Close to 100 lay leaders participated and once again found the time to be worthwhile, helpful and informative. If you

are reading this and are wondering why you didn't know about this gathering, please make sure that you receive our weekly e-news. If you are not on our mailing list, please subscribe to them by going to the synod website, where you will find a link you can click to subscribe. Once you are a subscriber, you will receive weekly synod newsletters, synod prayer requests, and other important updates as we are journeying together in Christ.

Sometimes I am asked what a Bishop is and what power they have? In a nutshell, as outlined by the South Dakota Synod constitution, the bishop is "this synod's pastor" (S8.12.). And as the pastor of the synod I am asked to "preach, teach, and administer the sacraments". My "primary responsibility (is) for the ministry of Word and Sacrament in ... (the SD) synod and its congregations, providing pastoral care and leadership of this synod and its congregations." Along with this main responsibility I am entrusted with ordaining pastors and deacons, attest/witness the extension of letters of call to pastors and deacons, exercise leadership, oversee and administer the work of the synod. Those are brought descriptors of what my day to day life as a Bishop entails, and they play out differently with each new day. But first and foremost I am called to be the pastor to the synod. I am honored to have been entrusted with this sacred call. Please know that I am always available for conversation, a cup of coffee (tea for me), and a visit to your congregation. I am eager to learn your story, hear your concerns and care for your faith formation.
