#### NTRODUCING A DIFFERENT PASTOR JOHN (WITH AN "H)

Greetings, Augustana Lutheran! As I wrap up a nearly twenty-year ministry at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Wessington Springs, I look forward to joining you next month as your pastor. Let me introduce myself a little.

I am the son of a farmer and have lived in small towns for most of my life. I have also spent a good deal of time in cities like El Paso,

TX, St. Paul, MN, and Jersey City, NJ. While the congregations I have served have mostly been rural and looked pretty much like me, I did my internship in a mostly African-American congregation, where I was definitely in the minority.

Being a pastor is my second career, my first being in television and radio, doing everything from photographing and reporting the news, to producing commercials, to playing classical, country, and even polka music on the radio. That background served me well as congregations, including my own, closed their doors and went online two years ago due to the pandemic.

Throughout most of my ministry I have sought to invest myself in the neighborhoods and communities in which I have lived and worked. That has included serving on community boards and volunteering for arts, health, and other nonprofit groups. My work toward a Doctor of Ministry Degree in congregational mission and leadership, earned in 2007, taught me that communities and congregations can work together to build leadership capacity in both.

I sought a call to Augustana in part because of your own involvement in the multicultural community that Sioux Falls has become. I enjoy partnering with others in ministry and am looking forward to working with your own varied ministry partners, including Pueblo de Dios.

My change in call was also prompted by my becoming an "empty-nester" this past year. Well, sort of. I will arrive in Sioux Falls with my wife Holly and our daughter Angela, who will be entering university studies this fall but will be living with us during the summer and working for the City of Sioux Falls as a lifeguard. Angela has three older brothers: Adam, who works part-time as a media assistant for Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls and as a lifeguard for Midco Aquatic Center; Nicolas, a student at Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey; and Zachary, a campus minister to international students in the Denver area.

I look forward to meeting and getting to know all of you and to your learning more about me as we journey together over the next several years. May the risen Christ, whom we celebrate this Easter season, accompany us on that journey.

From the Bishop's Desk

Dear SD Synod,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit! Driving across the State I can see that we are pretty dry. I pray for rain and moisture to water our parched lands. I also lift up prayers for our ranchers and farmers. It's not only the land that is parched, but spirits can run dry too. You may remember that in the very first months of my term you were invited to a farm summit in Mitchell SD. We shared in

the joys and challenges of farming and ranching, learned about resources, and were assured that God's always close at hand. At the same time of the farm summit, I also collaborated with Lutheran Social Services in SD. We partnered to offer Mental Health First Aid training to our leaders so that they can learn about the first signs of distress. But we also developed a webbased tool called Psychological First Aid. It is designed with your neighbor in mind. You can take this web-based training at your pace and at your time. It strives to equip you with what you need to read early warning signs of mental health issues, and gives you tools to be a good neighbor to your neighbor. Please watch for the link to come your way soon via our synod's e-news. If you currently do not receive the e-news, please sign up at www.sdsynod.org.

Last but not least, many ask about how to best support the Ukrainian refugees. At this time your monetary gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) or Lutheran World Relief (LWR) are the best help you can provide as they aid relief efforts on the ground. Our ministry partner LSS is in close communication with the federal government to see how to best assist refugees that will find their way to the United States.
