

THE PENTECOST FIRE STILL BURNS AT AUGUSTANA! by Pastor John Paulson



Sunday May 28, the Church celebrates Pentecost, the day the church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit with wind and "what seemed to be tongues of fire" (Acts 2:3) to the first apostles. People from many different lands heard the good news of Jesus Christ in their own languages. This was the beginning of the global spread of the gospel and therefore Pentecost has been called the "birthday of the Church." Word of this spectacular event spread like, well, wildfire, followed by missionaries going to proclaim God's word in person and making disciples for Jesus throughout the known world. Some may long for that fire to return to the church. I want to suggest that it still burns.

For two days in April people from twenty-five Spanishspeaking households came to Augustana to hear good news in their own language, the good news being that there were people here to help them complete the piles of paperwork necessary to enjoy the freedoms enjoyed by . This good news came courtesy of the nonprofit group The Naomi Project.

Once a month, around a hundred families show up here, spurred by the good news that there is food here for them, courtesy of the Food to You Mobile Food Pantry. On Thursday, May 16 it will be Augustana's and Pueblo de Dios' turn to volunteer for this monthly effort.

On Sundays people speaking English, Spanish, and other languages as well gather for worship to and hear the good news proclaimed in words they can understand with their siblings in Christ from Augustana and Pueblo de Dios. In other words, the Pentecost fire that filled the world with God's good news back in the First Century still burns right here at Augustana! And the wind? Well, this is South Dakota; need I say more? May that good news "blow you away" and ignite your heart with praise!

### Augustana Lutheran Church Council Minutes March 13, 2023

**CALL TO ORDER** at 6:07 by President Jim. Present were: Pastor John Paulson, Jim Sanden, Dave Stellingwerf, Jennifer Soule, Linda Sanden, Terry Engebretson.

**DEVOTIONS** Pastor John led devotions based on Corinthians where Paul speaks on weakness is really a strength.

**MINUTES** Jennifer motioned to accept the Feb minutes and Dave seconded. Motion carried.

### FINANCIAL MATTERS/

**TREASURER'S REPORT** Linda reported that ELBO bill was an additional \$519 and a furnace motor was replaced at \$580. Linda is using cash accounting at this time and has trained on Quick Books which will soon be used. The treasurer's report included current outstanding bills and bank balances as well as receipts and expenses for January and February. We have \$4327 left on the mortgage. Jennifer motioned to accept this report and Dave seconded. Motion carried.

**CORRESPONDENCE/SYNOD NEWS** Pastor John reported the Conference Assembly was Sunday, March 5. **MINISTRY AREAS** 

**Pueblo de Dios** Joint Council Meeting on Partnership Agreement- Pastor John will set up a meeting for this month.

**Worship Ministry** Holy Week and Easter-Maundy Thursday service with communion on April 6, time TBD. April Communion- Communion will be the 2nd and 4th Sunday.

**Stewardship Ministry** Mortgage Retirement-\$4327 left. Online Giving-Pastor John meeting with Tithely tomorrow, which seems to be a simpler method than Vanco.

**Christian Education** LOGOS- We discussed how to generate more interest. Would a summer program work? Summer Youth Programming/Camp- Are there youth in the area who would attend VBS?

**Servant Ministry** Iftar Dinner-Terry had spoken with Taneeza Islam regarding dates for the Iftar. Our date preference (after Easter) would not work with Ramadan this year. Linda motioned to table the dinner for this year and Jennifer seconded. Motion carried.

**Property Management Ministry** Speaker Update- We hope to update from 2 speakers to 4, dealing with a company from Brookings. Dave will speak with the payment donor to see if this agreement is possible. People in the back of the church have trouble hearing the service. Parking Lot Agreement- This is an unsolved agreement. The people in the house south of the lot want their parking spots to be kept open. AnAirBnB wanted to use our lot for overflow parking for their business which we are unable to allow.

Elevator Maintenance- KONE suggested preventative maintenance. The door maintenance modules need maintenance at a cost of \$3000. We will revisit this issue next year. Other- Jim reported that some light bulbs have security cameras installed in them, which may be an option for the church.

### **ALL ABOARD FOR STORY JUNCTION!**




