--theme for 140 year celebration.

Starting with this newsletter, tidbits of the history of God's house at 235 N Prairie, currently referred to as Augustana Lutheran Church will occur through the end of December as preparations ensue for the 140 year celebration in January, 2023. Detailed history can be found in Gail Jereb room, Pastor's office and every nook and cranny in and outside the church building.

It's closing in on the end of 1882. Chester Arthur is President of the United States, FDR is 11 months old, and the first Labor day is celebrated on September 5. December 28, a small district named Sioux Falls in the Dakota Territory (becoming South Dakota in 1889) saw the organization of a church named the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Church (SELC).

Interesting? Ironic? Holy Spirit? December 28 is the fourth day of Christmas. Could it be that our true love (Jesus the Christ) sent to us four calling birds named Matthew, Mark, Luke and John? The gospel writers gave us teachings, delivered by our Savior, on how we should love God and love one another. Who's to say that the start of SELC wasn't a call to shed light on the three french hens (Father, Son, and Holy Ghost)? Nevertheless, Pastor John Randall helped organize churches in Benton, Beaver Valley and SELC in Sioux Falls. SELC was on its way with worship being held in members' homes (Swedish being the only language spoken at these services) until such time a sit could be found for a church. The church started with 16 members – 140 years later, members that are physically in the present day church for worship is 16 (give or take).

Six months in (June 25, 1883), a lot located on the SE corner of 6th & Spring in Sioux Falls was purchased. A church was built and the first service held was January 6, 1884. That summer SELC and Benton came together as one parish. The first Sunday school was held on January 8, 1885. In 1900, (SELC now being led by Revered CE Lindsten), the church building was moved to face Spring Avenue, a tower constructed, a basement dug and furnace installed.

1905 brought a mention of English speaking services being provided. Pastor Lindsten made the call – services the two languages were alternated. This change was slow and painful. Pastor Martin Gustafson (pastor from 1916 – 1921) handled the two languages as if one. 100 plus years later, the church houses a Spanish speaking congregation – Pastor Jon Halverson handled the two languages as one. Swedish/English, Spanish/English. The languages are different but the messages are the same, bringing glory to God. We are all one in the Spirit.

Time progressed and the need for a larger church was evident. In 1921, a lot at 7th & Prairie was purchased (at this time, parish with Benton was dissolved).




Noisy Offering-The Noisy Offering is going to Church on the Street.

This is a riveting memoir about the author's childhood in Idaho, growing up in a large Mormon family with fundamentalist parents who opposed public education and modern medicine. The author was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom and after that, pursued learning for a decade, eventually earning a PhD in history.



Consider joining this group for a lively discussion each Wednesday (even if you can't make it every single week). We will spend approximately 5-6 weeks reading and discussing this selection. Reading assignments each week are usually short enough to complete in an hour or less, so you aren't burdened with too much at a time.



FOOD-TO-YOU -




